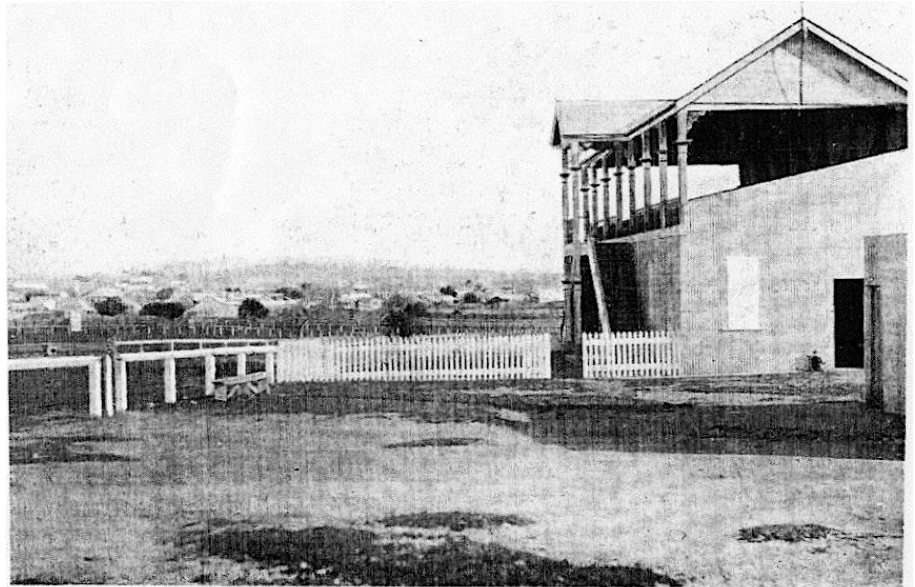

Note the projecting gable and column supports over the stairs, which are flush to the main grandstand.

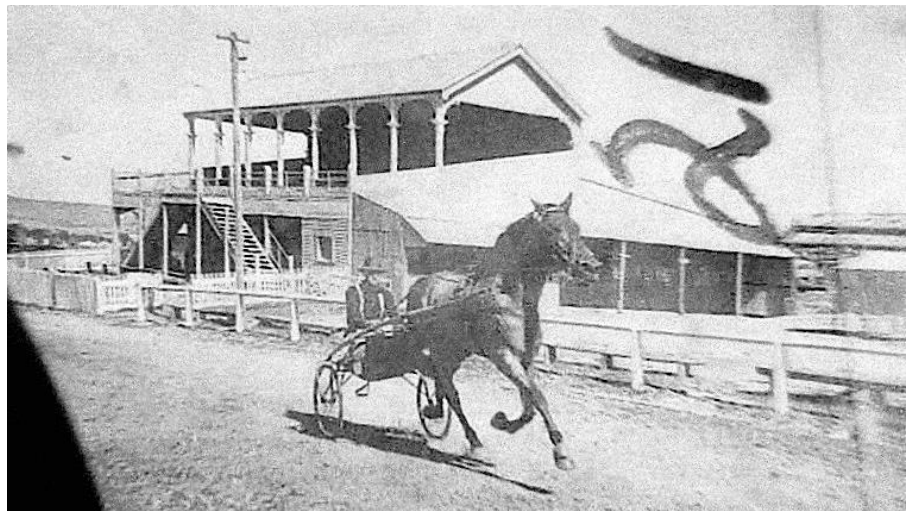

Comment	The 19 th century colonial roof form with encircling verandah would suggest this is an early structure. Although the verandah is enclosed, the building retains a classic colonial form.

Comment	Double roof form Federation dwelling with windows and doors intact. Prominent location.

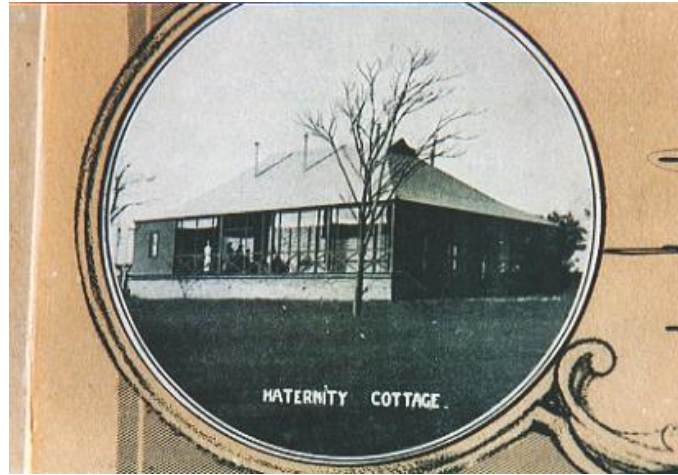

Comment	Very well detailed brick dwelling. Castellated top to bay window. Prominent location

Address	Camp Street (opposite hospital)

Comment	A large-roofed Federation bungalow with paired roof vents and verandah portico in well-maintained condition. Verandah is under the primary roof. Building is prominently located.

Address	Grenfell Hospital, Camp Street

Comment	Opened in 1914, it was the first maternity cottage in NSW, and the foundation stone was laid by the honourable WA Holman MLA, newly elected Premier of NSW. Strong historic association with growth of town between 1906 and 1915

Address	Grenfell Hospital, Camp Street
Property description	
Comment	<p>The mortuary was dismantled prior to construction of a new hospital wing in about 2000. The structure is understood to be stored on site.</p> <p>The mortuary is historically very significant. The efforts by the community to have the mortuary reconstructed, as originally promised by the Dept of Health, demonstrate the strong social feelings that they hold for the structure.</p>

Comment	Traditional Federation timber cottage with good details and period fence. Note also scalloped fascia board, side lights to front window and flatter pitch than earlier versions of this style.

Comment	The cottage on the left has a steeper roof pitch and is likely to be older, the one on the right retains good detailing.

DAGMAR STREET



Name	Victorian style brick dwelling
Address	11 Dagmar Street
Property description	
Comment	<p>Symmetrical Victorian brick cottage. Highly decorative columns to verandah. The form appears rare in Grenfell's context. It may be an early example of the use of brick in a formal residence in the town.</p> <p>Note the magnificent Helm Oak on the left</p>

Address	13 Dagmar Street (SW corner of Dagmar and Forbes)
Property description	
Comment	<p>Large, well formed brick bungalow with pronounced gables. The property is complete with matching fence.</p> <p>Built for Alf Bembrick 1928. The plane fell in the middle of Forbes St near the lane 1929. Called "Bezwada"</p> <p>Same as 'Chesterfield' at Wirega</p>

Comment	Federation bungalow with unusual details – rectangular projecting bay window on left hand side, small gable to verandah, angular brackets to sunhood and soffit, angular gable decoration

Truss columns and concrete verandah would not be original.</p> <p>Belonged to Goodridges – orchard at side where the walnut tree is. Former residence of Clarice Simpson</p>

Comment	Two Federation style bungalows with very similar form. Both built by Jack Peck.

Comment	A well proportioned and detailed 2 storey brick building with tiled roof and classical proportions. One of the larger buildings in Grenfell. Built 1930
