Family members slept outside on the verandah.</p> <p>Bought by Percy Taylor, retired farmer. Sold to Bernard and Robyn Stray. Became "A Stray Gallery". Sold to Dawn Troy then sold to Robert and Pam Livingston</p>

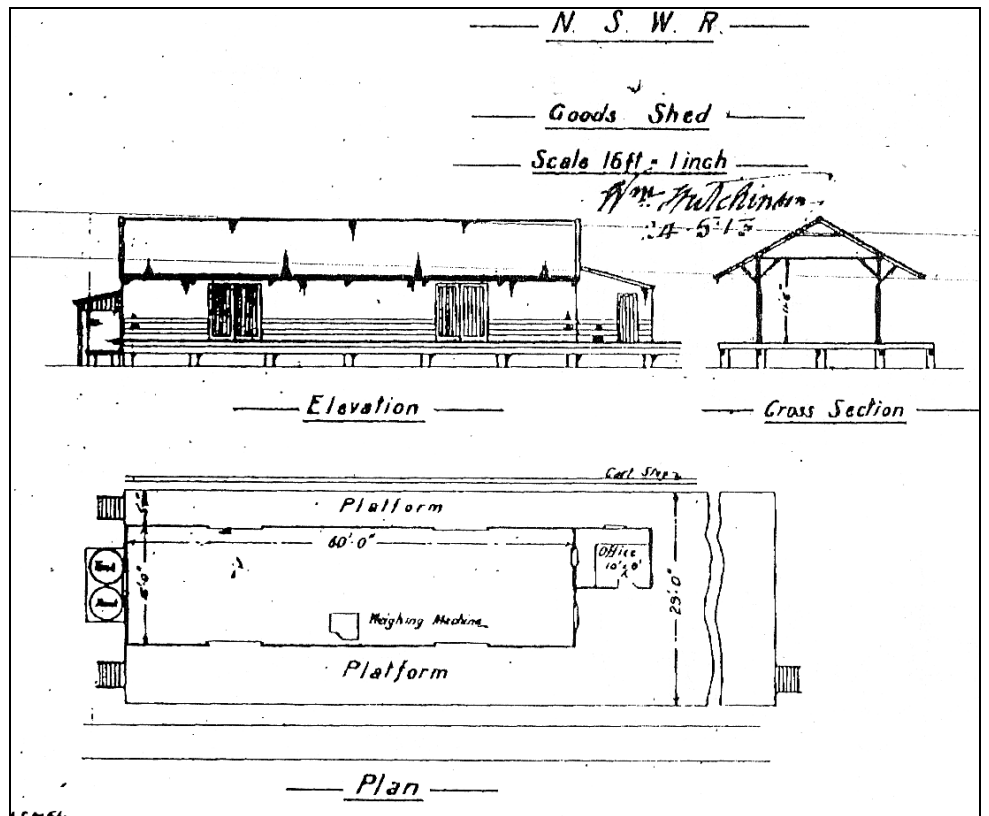
